Speech and Language Development Checklist

3 Months

Cries and grunts; has different cries for different needs

I Makes a lot of cooing and gooing sounds

Responds to parent/caregiver voice

I Takes a turn by looking, waiting, and making facial expressions during singing and tickling games

- Turns toward sounds
- I Startles at sudden loud noises
- 2 Watches faces. Loves smiles and sing-song voices. Is afraid of loud, angry voices

I Smiles and laughs when familiar parent smiles and laughs

6 Months

- I Startled by loud or sudden noises
- Responds when name is called
- Babbles; i.e., "Ba-ba-ba", "goo-goo", squeals for attention
- Participation Recognizes familiar faces and objects
- Injoys games like "peek-a-boo", tickling games
- Reaches for, holds, and puts toys in mouth
- I Smiles and laughs in response to parents' smiles and laughter

12 Months

2 Uses 3 to 5 different words

Pollows simple instructions; i.e., "Sit down", "Don't touch"

Inderstands "no," and simple requests "Where is your ball?"

Imitates sounds ("Whee!", "uh-oh!") and actions (wave, head shake)

I Gets attention by looking at your eyes while using sounds, pointing, bringing things to show you

It is to sing along with music

18 Months

Prollows simple instructions (i.e., Show me the... Give me the...)

Points to 3 body parts upon request (i.e., eyes, nose, mouth)

Inderstands more words than she can say

I Uses at least 20 words consistently; words do not have to be clear i.e., "Mama" or "ba" for "ball"

P Says "No"

Asks for something by pointing and using sounds or words (points to cookie and says, "num num")

2 Years

Ises 100- 150 words and combines two to four words in phrases (e.g., "moe tee" for "more cheese," "Truck go down.")

P Follows 2-step instructions: "Go find your teddy and show it to Grandma."

P Answers questions correctly with "yes" or "no"

Begins to offer toys to other children and to imitate other children

Uses many different speech sounds at beginning of words (p,b,m,t,d,n,h,w)
Asks "What's that?" and "Where?"

30 Months

I Uses more than 350 words

I Understands words that describe (hot, big, little, sticky, wet, a little, a lot, more)

I Uses "I," "You," "Mine" and "Me"

I Uses some adult grammar: "Two cookies," "Bird flying," "Daddy's car."

Injoys being around other children and takes short turns with them

I Uses words to answer "What" and "Where" questions ("What is he/she doing?""Where's the baby?")

Remembers and understands familiar stories

3 Years

Inderstands same/different, one/all, heavy, night/day

Injoys pretend play and playing with other children

I Talks about something that happened in the past (e.g., trip to Grandma's)

I Says 4-7 words in a sentence "I want my red ball"

Inderstands and asks "Who?" "What?" "Where?" and "Why?" questions

2 Adults outside of family understand at least half of what child says

4 Years

Pollows three-step instructions; i.e., "Get your boots, put them on and go outside."

I Tells stories with a clear beginning, middle and end, and can anticipate what will happen next in a story

Ises adult-type grammar

I Starts a conversation and keeps it going on the same topic for three turns

I Answers "Who?" "How?" and "How many?" questions
